As a natural product, honey varies in composition, but the main components are carbohydrates. The total sugar content is about 80%, of which glucose accounts for about 27-36% and fructose about 33-42% [2]. In mixed honeys, these components are present in approximately a 1:1.2 ratio. When non-aqueous solvents are used, deviations from the natural composition can occur.

Effects described

Honey is used in cosmetic products for cleaning and for skincare and haircare. The working group currently has no sufficiently confirmed scientific data to evaluate an antibacterial and moisture-retaining efficacy. If only honey flavouring is used for perfuming, claims should clearly indicate this.
