
Seniors in the U.S.

- The numbers of seniors are on the rise.
- In the 2000 U.S. census:
 - □ The total population was 281 million.
 - □ There were 35 million individuals age 65 and over.
- By 2011, the first wave of the 65 million Baby Boomers will turn 65.

Seniors in the U.S.

- By 2030 there will be 70 million individuals in the U.S. age 65 or older.
- U.S. citizens are volunteering 20% more than they did 20 years ago, and seniors are responsible for nearly all of this increase.

Is ACS Engaging Senior Chemists?

- Some membership incentives are already in place.
 - □ Retired member status:
 - Must have 30 years paid membership and be retired
 - May place free ads in C&EN 6 times per year seeking part-time employment
 - Dues reduced by 50%
 - □ Emeritus member status:
 - Must have 35 years paid membership, be retired, and over 70 years old
 - Pay no meeting registration
 - \Box 50 year members:
 - Receive *C&EN* at no cost
 - Pay no dues
 - Pay no meeting registration

Is ACS Engaging Senior Chemists?

- Senior Chemists Committees exist in some Local Sections.
- However, in the 1999 Mature Career Chemists Survey (CEPA), a majority of respondents reported not having been to a local section function in recent times.

Involve Your Seniors

Communicate with them regularly via:

 Local Section publications
 Local Section and Division newsletters
 Local Section and Division Web sites

 Even if they have been a member for a long time they may not know what support is available to them—create a brochure with local opportunities.

Involve Your Seniors

- Start volunteers with small, specific, measurable tasks.
- Ask them what they prefer to do and make offers accordingly.
- Consider that some may shun computers while others may not.
- Offer a computer training course.


