

Information leaflet for new members

The EU GDPR, which entered into force on 25 May 2018, provides, inter alia in Article 13, that the person responsible for the collection of personal data must provide certain information to the person/s concerned.

4. The purpose of the data processing

Member services, member support, and the realization of the statutes according to § 2 of the GDCh statutes in the version of 06. November 2014

5. Admissibility of data processing

Consent of the member, balancing of mutual interests

6. Recipients or categories of recipients to whom the data is/or will be disclosed

Tax obligations (DATEV eG)

Software and Database applications for processing

Cooperation with joint specialist groups/divisions:

Trade/Technical Magazines, including shipments

7. Deadlines for data deletion

One year after cancellation of membership, tax data will be according to the legal requirements achieved

8. Data transmission to a non European Union (EU) country or an international organization

Should there be a need to process data in a third country (ie outside the European Union (EU) or the European Economic Area (EEA)) in connection with the use of third party services or disclosure or transmission of data to third parties, this will only take place if it is to fulfill our (pre) contractual obligations, on the basis of your consent, on the basis of a legal obligation or on the basis of our legitimate interests.

Rights of the Persons concerned

In order to do justice to the transparency and modalities regulated in Art. 12 of the EU GDPR, the person responsible for the matter must subsequently inform the persons concerned about the rights of the person.

a) Right to information (Article 15)

The data subject has the right to ask the person responsible for confirmation of the processing of the personal data in question. The person responsible will provide a copy of the personal data that is the subject of the processing. For all other copies requested by the data subject, the person responsible may request a reasonable fee based on the administrative costs involved.

b) Correction (Article 16)

The data subject has the right to demand correction or completion of personal data concerning them.

c) Cancellation (Article 17) - "Right to be forgotten"

d) Right to object (Article 21)

If the data subject objects to the processing of personal data concerning them for any reason, the controller may no longer process such data unless he/she can demonstrate compelling legitimate grounds for the processing that affects the interests, rights and freedoms of the data subject Person predominate, or the processing serves the assertion, exercise or defense of legal claims.

e) Right to complain to a supervisory authority

Individuals affected have the right to lodge a complaint with the relevant competent supervisory authority.

f) Consequences of non-provision of personal data

Failure to provide or object the processing of personal data of the data subject would result in a withdrawal from the GDCh. After expiration of the deletion period or other legal obligations to store all data, the person/s concerned will be deleted.
